VEHICLE TAKEN IN A SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CARJACKING DISCOVERED BY SAUSALITO'S LICENSE PLATE RECOGNITION CAMERAS

On Friday, October 27, 2017, at approximately 6:43PM, the Sausalito Police Department received an alert from our License Plate Recognition Cameras of a stolen vehicle entering Sausalito from Alexander Avenue. The vehicle, a 2015 Chrysler, had been taken in Huntington Beach during a carjacking on Thursday, October 26, 2017. The Chrysler had been taken by a man who had been armed with an approximate 8 inch knife.

Sausalito Police Officers immediately responded and conducted a comprehensive search of the area. Officers quickly located the Chrysler and affected a stop on it in the 800 block of Bridgeway. The driver of the Chrysler, Arthur Reznick (27 year-old resident of Los Angeles), and a passenger were detained without incident.

Investigation at the scene resulted in Reznick being arrested for possession of a stolen vehicle and possession of stolen property and he was booked into the Marin County Jail. The passenger was released at the scene when Officers were able to determine that he was a hitchhiker who did not know the Chrysler was stolen.

The Huntington Beach Police Department will be conducting further investigation regarding the carjacking and Reznick's possible involvement.

Since the City of Sausalito's License Plate Recognition Camera program became operational on Thursday, May 18, 2017, eleven (11) stolen vehicles have been recovered leading to the arrest of fourteen (14) individuals. The goal of the License Plate Recognition Camera program is to increase public safety by utilizing technology to alert Law Enforcement to wanted vehicles, enhance post-crime investigative abilities, and deter crime by increasing the likelihood of suspect identification.

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
